We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2022-2023 educational progress for the Onsted Elementary School. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Onsted Elementary School has not been given one of these labels.

School Improvement Plan

Onsted Elementary faculty have determined the need to focus on English Language Arts as our school improvement goal. Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science are important as well. Our team focus in these areas is through literacy and how important strong literacy skills are to improve all other curricular areas.

We are focused on providing a strong multi-tiered student support system and providing high quality professional development to strengthen the skills of our teaching staff. The key initiatives that we are focused on include:

- Engaging families in the learning process is a crucial component of success for our students. OES is a school-wide Title I school. We take great pride in working with our community, families, staff, and students. Parent-Teacher conferences took place in the fall and in the spring. Average attendance was 97% in the fall and 96% in the spring. In addition, teachers created Individual Reading Intervention Plans (IRIPs) for students who need extra support. These plans are shared with families at team meetings as soon as reading difficulties are diagnosed.

Curriculum

The curriculum at Onsted Elementary is built upon the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and Michigan's Grade Level Content Expectations (GLCE). Teachers follow the shared agreements and pacing guide for unit topics, genres, skills, and content. Our staff utilizes many different approaches to ensure that each student learns and demonstrates growth. Grade level teams use data to make decisions regarding curriculum, assessment, and remediation. Information can be found on the elementary website.

M-Step Data

Students at Onsted Elementary School in 5th grade score higher on the ELA, Math and Science M-Step assessment but below the state percentage on the Social Studies portion. Students in 4th grade at OES score below the state average on both ELA and Math. 3rd grade students at OES score above the state average on the ELA assessment and below the state average on Math. No consistent trends are noted among subgroups (gender, socioeconomic) across grade levels at OES.

MAP Data from NWEA

Onsted Elementary students also take the NWEA MAP assessment three times per year to provide information for teachers on the growth of their students in math and reading. The following chart lists Onsted Elementary data from the NWEA MAP test.

Specialized Schools Annual Report

Students enrolled at Onsted Elementary School who are in need of specific services receive special education services through the Lenawee Intermediate School District (LISD). In addition to the specialized schools, students receive diagnostic testing, school psychology, school social work, physical and occupational therapy, career technical education, special needs training and speech pathology services as planned in their Individualized Education Plans (IEPs).

The Lenawee Intermediate School District provides educational services to students from birth through age 26 who have severe handicaps. Students with severe physical, mental, emotional or sensory impairments may receive their educational program at a classroom operated by the LISD. Students from Onsted Elementary School attended LISD classroom programs during the 2022-23 school year.

In cooperation with the Lenawee County Probate Court, the LISD operates the juvenile education program housed at the Maurice Spear Campus.

LISD operates special education classrooms in local districts including classrooms for students with physical or other health impairments and hearing impairments in Madison; and classrooms for students with cognitive impairments in Tecumseh and Adrian. Some students from Onsted Elementary School attended these programs during the 2022-23 school year.

Local districts operate special education classrooms open to students from other districts. Onsted Elementary School placed no students in any other districts during the 2022-23 school year. No other elementary schools placed students at Onsted Elementary during the 2022-23 school year.

Points of Pride

Onsted is a welcoming, rural community. Our school is the centerpiece of the community. We take great pride in offering many community events as well as community education, educational workshops, and learning opportunities for students and adults. Students in the elementary school have daily specials, including: physical education, art, library, music and STEAM. We offer several on-line programs for our students to use 7 days a week, 24 hours per day to practice and improve math and reading skills. We offer a comprehensive response to intervention program which provides academic support to students who struggle in the core academic areas. We offer family events such as: family reading nights, curriculum nights, PTO dinners, and OCRC which is our community recreation program for soccer, baseball, softball, football, and basketball. Our students are very active in sponsoring community service events. Our highly qualified staff includes a guidance counselor and school nurse. They have organized many programs such as our career prep program, Healthy Schools wellness committee, and TRAILS social and emotional education program.
